PIPER DAVIDSON, WHO PIPED FOR THE 33rd BATTALION, 10th DIVISIONAL PARTY LAST NIGHT, PASSED ON THE INFORMATION THAT COLONEL HATT OF BRIGADIER TOPP, DSO, MC, AND BRIGADE-MAJOR ROY BURGESS HAD THE MEAL TO EXTEND HIS COMPLIMENTS TO THE OFFICERS. THE DAY WAS A BUSY ONE FOR ALL OFFICERS WHO WERE PREPARING FOR THE CHANGE IN DISPOSITIONS ORDERED BY THE DIVISIONAL COMMAND.
