JUN	15		<p>At 0315hrs the C.O. was called into a conference at Bde H.Q. where he was ordered to move the unit by march route to an area in the Puttenham district. At 0545hrs the C.O. and the I.C. left for the Puttenham area for a recce of the intended assembly area. At 0750hrs the Adj received orders from the B.M. cancelling all orders issued and ordering the unit to stand by. At 0930 the regt was ordered to move by H.T. at 1230hrs to the original area laid down by the original route. The move was accomplished without incident. Arrived in the concentration area orders were received at 1615hrs to attack enemy parachute troops. When full arrangements were made for the operation the orders were cancelled and the bn was ordered to move to a concentration area preparatory to an attack on the Downs where heavy enemy concentrations were reported. The move by march route commenced at 2300hrs.</p> <p>The bn arrived in the allotted area at approximately 0400hrs and immediately went into action. All objectives had been taken at 1030hrs and the message NEGATIVE WATERLOO was received by the C.O. terminating the exercise.</p> <p>A conference at Bde H.Q. was attended by the C.O. at 1200hrs at which time orders were issued by the Bde comd for return to Aldershot by march route - a distance of 45 hrs. The remainder of the day was spent in leisure.</p>	
	16		<p>The bn started by march route for Aldershot. The weather was extremely hot and a 2hrs stop was made at midday. Tys were quartered in fields near Amberley for the night.</p>	APP X 6
	17		<p>The march was completed by 1500hrs this date. The weather was abnormally warm and all ranks were pleased to be finished with the grind.</p>	
	18		<p>The morning was spent by the bn in cleaning equipment, arms and vehicles.</p>	
	19		<p>Five offrs attended the arty range-practice at Larshill.</p>	
	20		<p>Information was received that the bn would be inspected 20 Jun 41 and preparations were made accordingly.</p>	
	21		<p>The bn moved to its inspection area at 0000hrs and was inspected at 1100hrs by His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester. All coys comds and the adj were presented to his Highness, who was an interested spectator at the exhibition of training staged for his benefit.</p>	
	22		<p>Major L.W.F. Wakefield commanded the bn parade in the absence of Col. Pearson, Major Nethersall and Major Jasperon on other business.</p> <p>Five offrs attended the arty practices at Larshill. Major Macdonald was i/c party.</p> <p>The Captains, Officers and Sergeants enjoyed an evening of dancing and entertainment in the Sergeants' Mess.</p> <p>Col. Pearson attended the first day of a two day exercise at Larshill. All bn comds and Brig. in the 3 Can Div were in attendance as spectators.</p>

Aldermot	1941	25	Information was received by the C.O. that this Regiment would move to a new area on the South Coast in a new defensive role for a period of at least a month. Preparations are to be made accordingly. An advance party under Lieut. D. A. Desiel was detailed to leave for the new area 24 Jun 41. Training programs for the week commencing 25 Jun 41 attached. A meeting of all officers was held at 1715 hrs in the Officers' Mess at which time the C.O. gave an APPENDIX account of all available information on the proposed move.	
	26		An Adv Party of 5 offrs and 40 O.Rs left the area for H.M. to assist in the turnover to this unit of the new areas. Bottle practices on the Henley ranges were carried out by two coys. A meeting of all officers in the 3 Cdn Div was addressed by Brigadier Kenneth on the subject, The Evolution of Tactics.
