OUR NEIGHBORS TO THE NORTH, THE CAMERON HIGHLANDERS OF OTTAWA LEFT CAMP BORDEN FOR ANOTHER POINT. THE ESSEX SCOTTISH LINED THE ROAD GOING TO HIGHWAY AND ESSEX SCOTTISH PIPE BAND PARADED TO THE RAILWAY STATION WITH BOTH SECTIONS. AT 1700 HOURS A TORNADO STRUCK PART OF BORDEN CAMP, WITH THE RESULT THAT PRACTICALLY ALL THE OFFICERS TENTS WERE BLOWN DOWN INCLUDING THE OFFICERS' MESS. THE WORST DAMAGE HOWEVER WAS DONE TO THE Q. U. STORES AND PARTICULARLY THE ORDERLY ROOM TENT WHICH WAS COMPLETELY WRECKED. RECORDS, PAPERS ETC. THAT WERE BEING USED AT THE TIME WERE CARRIED 500 TO 1000 YARDS IN SOME CASES AND IT WAS A JOB COLLECTING, SORTING AND CHANGING SAME. THERE WAS ALSO SOME DAMAGE DONE TO STORES. FORTUNATELY THE PAYMASTERS TENT WAS PARTLY PROTECTED BY THE KITCHEN BUILDING AND MERELY FLOPPED ON TO THE TABLES SO LITTLE REAL HARM WAS DONE TO P.U. RECORDS. ALL THE MENS' MESS TENTS WERE BLOWN DOWN BUT FORTUNATELY THE MENS BELL TENTS MISSED THE BRUNT OF THE STORM AND ONLY ABOUT 5 FAILED TO STAND THE STRAIN. HOWEVER, TENTS WERE PITCHED AGAIN AND AFTER SOME EXCHANGES WERE MADE AT CORDANCE REGARDING DAMAGED TENTS, MOST OF THE CAMP WAS PUT IN SHADE BEFORE NIGHTFALL. THE LEAVE TRAIN WHICH WAS SCHEDULED TO LEAVE BORDEN AT 1830HRS WAS	
			DELAYED ON ORDER OF THE G.O. AND DID NOT DEPART FROM CAMP UNTIL 2145 HOURS.	

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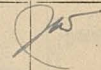
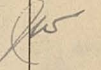
