McMaughton, C.B., G.M.G., D.S.O., LtGen. H.D.G. Crear, D.S.O., Major-Gen. P.J. Montague, C.M.G., D.S.O., M.C., V.D., and Brigadier M.H.S. Penhale, Commanding 4th Cdn. Inf. Bde. The parade was colourful with "Red Tabs" and junior staff offre as Col. Ralston inspected the neat lines of the entire 4th Cdn. Inf. Ede. At random, the Hinister of National Defence stopped and spoke to individual soldiers while Corps photographers made pictorial history of the first war honours the 4th Cdn. Inf. Ede. have gained via DIEPPE. The Colonel remarked as follows: "I was in wilmbor to four sons, Mrs. Murphy who had apparently lost all of them at DIEPPE. Since then, we are informed that two sons are alive and prisoners of war. I observed how proud all parents were even when informed of personal lost that their sons had taken part at DIEPPE. The raid has given all Genedians the knowledge that they can stend up to the Germans and it has instilled confidence in them.
