Remembering the Hochwald



For the first time in three years, the Hochwald Mixed Dining-In was held on 11 March 2023. The Hochwald is generally an annual regimental event which is held commemorate the valour of Major Fred Tilston on 1 March 1945, during the Battle of the Rhineland. He led C Company of the Essex Scottish Regiment in an attack on German positions in the Hochwald Forest just west of the Rhine River. Though badly wounded, Major Tilston continued to lead C Company as long as he was able. For his gallantry in the face of battle, he was awarded the Victoria Cross.

This year's event was held at the Windsor Club on Riverside Drive. It was a smaller venue with limited seating but it was clearly a success.

The Windsor Club provided an excellent menu with a splendid view of the waterfront. The Windsor Regiment Band entertained the diners during the meal. It also was the first time that

our Pipes and Drums had played at a public event in quite some time. They came dressed in their new doublets and refurbished feather bonnets which were greatly appreciated by those in attendance.

The regimental family was also joined by various guests and dignitaries including the 31 Brigade Commander Col Chris Brown, Deputy Brigade Commander LCol John Hodgins, Windsor Police Chief Jason Bellaire, Windsor Fire Chief Stephen Laforet, Legion Branch 642 President Comrade Len Maynard as well as representatives from the City of Windsor and the Province of Ontario.

All agreed that it was good to be able to revive this long-standing tradition of the Essex & Kent Scottish. It had been greatly missed during the global Covid-19 pandemic. We look forward to continuing the Hochwald Dinner as an annual event.

Trooping of the Colours

The Trooping of the Colours is a significant event in the life of any regiment. For the Essex and Kent Scottish this is scheduled to occur on 11 May 2023 to 14 May 2023. We will be honoured by the presence of our Colonel-in-Chief, His Royal Highness Prince Michael of Kent.

It will be a busy weekend so a few words of explanation are appropriate. The Presentation and Trooping of the new King's and Regimental Colours will take place in the Riverfront Plaza in the City of Windsor while the lay-up of the old Colours and Freedom of the City will take place in the Municipality of Chatham-Kent. These very special occasions. The new Regimental Colours will bear new battle honours of



Detroit, Maumee, Niagara (War of 1812) and Afghanistan.

While the Trooping of the Colours is usually a public event, the displaying of Colours to the general public is a secondary consideration. The Colours of a Regiment have an important place as the traditional rallying point of soldiers in time of battle. The primary reason for the Trooping is to allow the members of the Regiment to connect with their Colours in a very personal way. To achieve this, rather than parading the Colours in front of the parade, the Colours will be trooped, i.e. marched through the ranks of the Regiment as it stands on parade. The Colours will pass before every member of the Regiment equally regardless of rank or appointment. The attendance of the public at this occasion is important because it honours both the Regiment and its Colours.

During the weekend, the old Colours will be laid-up in Christ Church Anglican Church in Chatham which is one of two Regimental churches. This will be the first time that Colours will be laid up in this church since 1954 when the Colours of the Kent Regiment were deposited there for safekeeping.
